



North and South Quilt Pattern - Kids

Finished Quilt Size: 40½" x 51½"

The perfect place to use up some of the Layer Cakes you've bought!

Fabric Requirements and Cutting:

*WOF = width of fabric

Please prewash your fabrics. The finished quilt may be going to someone who is sick.

Fabric	Yardage	Example Quilt Colors	Cut

Misc Squares	na	Scrappy	25	8½" x 8½"
Border	¾ yd	Orange Print	2	6" x 40½"
Binding	½ yd	Dk Blue	6	2½" x WOF*
Backing**	1¾**	Your Choice	na	na

**This quilt is designed to need only one length of backing fabric. However, if your backing fabric isn't wide enough, please add a strip to make it so.

Quilt Top Assembly

Please read the instructions before beginning.

Use a ¼" seam allowance.

Arrange twenty-five 8½" squares into a pleasing arrangement of 5 rows of 5 blocks each.

The example shown has 25 different fabrics, however, you could easily use two fabrics (a light and a dark) or alternate scrappy squares with a single fabric.

Stitch blocks in each row together. To ensure your seams nest when you stitch rows together, press seam allowances:

- To the right for the top, middle and bottom row, and
- To the left for the 2nd and 4th rows

After stitching these 25 blocks measure 40½" x 40½" from edge to edge.

Add a border strip to the top and bottom. Press.

After adding the borders your quilt top measures 40-1/2" x 51-1/2" from edge to edge.

Machine Quilting

NO Hand-Tied or Hand-Quilted quilts to meet the needs of the organizations POP donates to.

No monofilament thread for quilting.

Sandwich the quilt top, batting and quilt back, and baste the layers either with safety pins or needle and thread. Use only 1/8" – 1/4", LOW-LOFT batting. MACHINE quilt the layers together using either walking foot or free motion quilting techniques. The choice is yours.

Know that this quilt will be loved and washed a lot so make sure that there is plenty of quilting to hold up to daily hospital washings. Quilt in the borders as well.

Bind the quilt using traditional binding. It can be either hand or machine stitched down.

Double and triple check that all the pins are out of the quilt.

Wash the finished quilt before turning it into the Guild.
