Cool Ties for our troops-.

These are a tube of fabric prepared with just a teaspoon of a pellet called Watersorb. Soaked in water for about 45 minutes they absorb up to 200% of their weight and keep people cool for a good number of hours. Troops wear them around their necks or tied like a headband. In the sweltering desert heat they are really welcome!

I would like to ask those interested to donate the start of the tie's by making the fabric tube to the specifications below. I will then add the watersorb and finish them off and deliver them to Operation Support our Troops.

If anyone is interested in doing this project through the summer and dropping them off to me I would be glad for that. I can give you some baggies of pellets for you to complete the entire tie as well. That would be wonderful! A baggie's worth makes about 20 ties. They are super, super easy to do!

Directions:

** Gender neutral fabrics**- no light fabrics as they get too dirty, no girly, floral etc. They love sports teams and novelty fabrics. 100% Cotton only- no homespun or light weave fabric please.

Cut fabric 4 1/2 inches by width of fabric.

Sew along the long side- 1/4 seam or serged.

Turn right side out

Press.

Sew across the width in the middle- (short side) -both ends are left open I will fill and finish from there.

Free Online Instructions

While our speakers and workshops are currently on hiatus, I would like to suggest that you check out the instructional YouTube videos of both Melinda Bula and Beth Helfter.

Melinda came to our guild a few years ago and has done a wonderful series of FREE YouTube video instructions on how to make her Zinnia quilt. For those of you who may have started the class, this is the perfect way to fall back in love with the process and complete your creation for display at our next show. She has even announced that she will soon be showing how to make another quilt featuring 3 different color zinnias all while using the single zinnia quilt pattern. Check it out!

Beth Helfter of Eva Paige Quilt Designs was to be our speaker in October and she teaches how to make totally scrappy half square triangles. I tried the method recently and found it to be an awesome and quick way to get a really scrappy look without loads of additional effort. I would suggest that you upsize your cut blocks by 1/4" in order to have perfectly trimmable blocks for piecing. Check her out on YouTube under Eva Paige Quilt Designs to see her accordion sewn scrappy half square triangles.
